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1.3. A brief overview of the institution and program under evaluation

Universum Collage was established in March 2004 in Prishtina and Ferizaj.

The Universum Collage offers study programs at the BA and MA levels: four Bachelor programs in Business and Management, Political Science, Computer Science, English and two master programs in Management and Diplomacy. Furthermore, the Collage offers two professional programs accredited by Peasrson Plc. – Level 5 in Nursing and Integrated Design.

The College is very proud of internationalization and globalization because established cooperation with some respected educational institutions in the world and has 78 Credit Mobility agreements. Besides that, according to the data on the College website, has more KA1 and KA2 projects than the majority of HEIs in Kosovo, combined.

The leadership at UC consists of The Board of Trustees, a President an Academic Council, which is led by Vice President for Academics, an Innovation and External Relations Vice President, an Operations Vice President and other bodies as determined by the Statute. The functions of the main governing bodies are premised on the principles of respect for normative acts, academic freedom, and refrain from political agenda, and respect for highest academic standards and rights.

The mission of Universum College is to support students to become good citizens, successful and broad-minded leaders and thrive in the Revolution 4.0, the digital and globalized era. They do this by providing one-on-one academic and life coaching, putting students and learning at the center in an innovative, digitally enhanced environment that fosters creativity, inquiry, teamwork and satisfactory knowledge.

The first of the five College mission pillars is: Student and Learning at the Centre. The Universum College policies put students and learning at the centre of their focus. The Universum College has modernized its curriculum by digitalizing the educational process in order to put students at the centre and enhance their learning process.

The mission of the new BA study program Design graphic, is accordance with the mission of the institution.





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2. PROGRAM EVALUATION

2.1. Mission, objectives and administration

As it is mentioned in the SER, "the mission of the proposed program is to provide advanced university training in the broad academic field of Graphic Design and to graduate highly professional students while equipping them with theoretical and practical training that will prepare them for a multitude of career options, locally, regionally, and internationally." At the general level of information provided, the mission of the study program is in compliance with the overall mission statement of the institution.

Regarding the consistency of the program with the National Qualifications Framework and the Framework for Qualifications of the European Higher Education Area, evidence-based information was provided in the SER and during the site visit. In particular, explicit formulations which would link the intended learning outcomes of the program to specific level descriptors relevant to the program were provided.

The SER contains very general statements on didactical approaches and research activities Quite often the statements are rather abstract or normative statements without giving information on how they implemented in the study program practically.

According to the statements in the SER and the available documentation, and during the site visit in the meetings with the management of College and professors it can be concluded that there are formal policies, guidelines and regulations dealing with recurring procedural or academic issues. It can be assumed that program topics related to administration and quality assurance of the program as well as the interaction between teachers and students and rights and duties of all stakeholder are well developed and well-known.

The Universum College does not publish relevant information and regulations on the web site of the College and are not available to all interested stakeholders.

- 1. The study program should strive for a revision of the didactic and research concept considering modern teaching practice and integration of **research** at the program level and strengthening the linkages between teaching and research.
- 2. Regardless of the fact that the management considers that it is not necessary to publish regulations publicly on the website, it is necessary to publish basic documents such as statute, student rights, study conditions etc. on the website in order for the general public to be aware of the College's activities.





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3. A particular priority should be to integrate e-learning and online teaching and learning at all levels of the teaching concept and the entire curriculum in a differentiated way.

2.2. Quality management

The SER contains a description of how quality management at the university works and which instruments it contains.

While it was stated in the SER that "We perceive quality management as a factor of a primary importance toward increasing the overall academic success. These mechanisms and procedures are developed by the institution, ..." no evidence that evaluation and planning for improvement processes are integrated into the normal planning process.

From the available documents and the discussions on site, it is clear that the data collected will also be used for continuous development. The corresponding responsibilities have been defined and are carried out by the appropriate persons.

It is not clear whether the results of the survey data, is being collected from students, graduates and employers, are made publicly available. Unfortunately, there are no reports on how the public or university members are informed about quality development in a public report.

Despite the statement "Limited financial resources because of low tuition fees" the maintenance and improvement of the quality system do not require large funds.

An example, of inconsistency in the quality management is by observing statement in the SER "Faculty provide CVs in a truncated standardized format." But when observing CVs forwarded with the accreditation documentation, the standard form of CV is not noticed, some of them are in Albanian, some are in English, some have a list of papers / exhibitions other do not, etc.

The above-mentioned example leads to the conclusion that the prescribed procedures of the quality management system are not implemented in full.

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2.3. Academic staff

According to tabular presentation of data of the academic staff (23 /24 pp) for the study program BA Graphic Design is engaged a total of 27 academic staff, 21 of them have full-time and 6 part-time contract. The academic staff formally consists of one associate professors and 26 lecturers.

Curricula vitae for 7 teachers were not included in the documentation, so it was not possible to check their competencies. Furthermore, the study program lists 3 teachers (Noli Mati, Floriana Lytfin, Valdrin Dervishaj) for whom there is nor data on employment or CV. Only two engaged teachers have doctoral degrees, and one of them is on part time. The most of other teachers are masters of arts.

At the Universum College website, in the "About us" section, there is the "Academic staff" section where can be found the list of academic staff, assuming that they are employees of Universum College. At that list is only few, exactly 6, name of academic staff who are engaged in the study program Graphic Design. This list is not corresponding with the list of engaged staff which is mentioned in the SER. Consequently, according to these different data, it is not clear how many of the academic staff are full time employees of the College.

The academic staff have been provided with relevant training opportunities and improvement of teaching competencies, but unfortunately there is no data on who of the teachers completed some education or training.

Academic staff evaluation is conducted regularly by students each mid semester and semester, professional parties and Head of Department. It is not clear whether the results of the evaluation are made publicly available. When it is said publicly available, it is mean the cumulative assessment of teachers involved in the study program without specific names.

The efforts of the institution and academic staff to participate in Erasmus staff mobility are commendable. Nevertheless, it has not been proven that these mobility is part of the strategy which will lead to teaching quality enhancement and improvement of the learning materials.

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2.4. Educational process content

The curriculum covers a range of qualifications required to work as a graphic designer in local or regional companies, professional firms in the field of different branches of the economy. External stakeholders have confirmed the local community's need for a study program that would educate designers for the market needs. The study program harmonizes and integrates the artistic and creative requirements with the academic need for a professional designer.

Overall, little information was provided about the why and how of the curriculum's structure corresponds to level 6 of the European Qualifications Framework, however, in general the definition of the learning outcomes at the program level corresponds to level 6 of the European Qualifications Framework.

The disciplines represented in the curriculum are provided in a logical flow and they meet the defined competencies at a general level. The learning outcomes are defined at the study program level, there is a sufficient number of comprehensible specificities.

Teachers believe that they have a well relationship with students because they have a lot of experience in working with students. At the beginning of the semester, learning outcomes are explained to help students understand their relevance to student's development. 4.6.

The teaching method, which is in used, is an interactive method, student-centred, where the student conducts seminars, various projects for different subjects, as well as field research required for this level of study.

According to the information, the complete lack of e-learning and online teaching as key elements of a modern teaching strategy was spotted.

The College has appropriate and valid mechanisms for verifying standards of student achievement. It is foreseen the given the teacher's experience in working with students, that appropriate, valid and reliable mechanisms will be used for verifying standards of student's achievement.





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In the available documentation there is no evidence that the policies and procedures include actions to deal with issues where standards of student achievement are inadequate or inconsistently assessed.

According to SER, "An important component of any curriculum is the involvement of non-academic partners ..." which is very commendable. It is not clear whether the College has signed cooperation agreements with partners as required by the standard.

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2.5. Students

The Universum College has a clear and formally adopted admission procedure at institutional level which the study program complies when organizing students' recruitment. According to the documentation admission requirements is consistently and fairly applied on all students.

The College has defined appropriate admission criteria for applicants and published them publicly.

The College uses the software DMIS, which hold all information of the students regarding their activities such as personal information, grades, passing/failure rate.

The submitted student assignments, seminar papers, or final papers have an adequate check for plagiarism through Academia Platform, the first anti-plagiarism system in the Albanian language. This statement is publicly available through the web site.

The rights and obligations of students are not publicly available. According to the SER, all regulations are explained in detail in the free and online UC accessible resources and through orientation day at the beginning of the academic year. However, the documents which deal with students' rights and obligations for example Status, Code of Ethics, Code of conduct, etc. are not available publicly on the main website of the College.

According to the teacher's statement, and the SER it is their obligation to be available at scheduled times for consultation and advice to students.

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2.6. Research

The study program has not defined scientific/applied research objectives, it is only mentioned: "Our aim is to expand our research range, quality, and products. To this end, we have adopted a new research strategy and created a stronger mechanism to carry out the objectives."

At the Universum College web homepage under section "Research", is the section "Research Strategy" where can be found only general statements related to research.

This general statements could be applied to all faculty and study programs and cannot replace the description of the particular action that would foster the involvement of students and academic staff in research activities at the program level as well as on the course level. The self-evaluation report does not contain information on the research development plan nor does it give information on the research plan of the study program regarding the reflection of scientific / applied research objectives.

Regardless of the fact that teachers have the obligation to publish with students in "Student Scientific Journal and Conference" (at least 4 articles) it is not clear how these are considered in staff evaluation and promotion criteria.

The statements " Engagement in research activities of teaching staff will be taken into consideration in staff evaluation processes and recommendations for potential promotion will be considered." and "The research department has in place mechanisms to ensure that our staff complies with requirements by the institution and also national norms." could not be confirmed by any available document.

According to the data from SER statistics on the number of published papers of academic staff and researcher it could be noted that they did not produce at least an average of one scientific /applied research publication or artistic outcomes/product per year for the past three years.

Most of the attached data is older than three years. The presented results of scientific and artistic work of academic staff are insufficient.

At the web homepage under section "Research", in the section "Staff Publication" there is no data of the publication of teachers who will be engaged in the study program Design,





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regardless of the fact that they are full-time employees of the College. The published data of the papers have not been updated, and the last publication date is from 2019 (only one).

There is no proven existence of policies establishing intellectual property rights and clear procedures set out for commercialization of ideas. As this is important part of the todays design work these have to be developed for staff and students.

- 4. Improve networking with international universities and/or international researchers in the interest fields. Try to establish joint organisation of research conferences.





- 5. Stimulate students and researchers to apply for the independent research grant and funds from the external funding, donors and projects.
- 6. Define higher influence of the published research papers and scientific publications in the career development for the teachers and assistants.





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2.7. Infrastructure and resources

The Universum College is located in the three Campuses: Prishtina, Ferizaj and Gjakova. As is mentioned in the Self-report, all campuses have modern infrastructure and offer well study conditions for students and the organization of the academic teaching process, as well as offers suitable opportunities for conducting research work.

The above-mentioned is shown in the video "Universum College Virtual Campus Tour" and "Universum College Design lab"

Considering that all three campuses are shown in the video material, it is not clear in which campus the teaching of the study program Design Graphic will take place.

According to the SER, UC management developed a strategic financial plan, but there is the impression that financial plan at the level of the study program are not demonstrate the sustainability of the study program for minimum of three years. It is not clear from the document how the study program is planned to be funded.

The facilities of The Universum College have lecture halls, laboratories equipped with adequate equipment such as computers, projectors, scanners and 3D scanners, printers, 3D printer, professional cameras, etc. According to the available data, there is no information about the adequate software required to maintain the study program.

The number of seats in the lecture rooms and seminar rooms according to the number of students in groups is sufficient.

According to the SER, the Universum has enough computers, but there is lack of adequate software for the disciplines of study included in the curriculum, with utilisation licence.

The Universum has its own library and reading room, it has enough room for the number of students who are admitted each academic year.

The efforts made to improve and enrich the book stock are commendable. However, at present moment, the library does not own a sufficient number of books.

At present, the infrastructure of the Universum is not adapted to meet the needs of students with disabilities.

- 1. Development of a financial plan at the level of the study program that would demonstrate the sustainability of the study program for the next minimum three years.
- 2. Continue to develop the book stock and the idea of making the library available to the general public.
- 3. It is considerable to encourage translation of the essential literature to the Albanian language.
- 4. Continue to procure the necessary software in accordance with the requirements of the study program.





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3. OVERALL EVALUATION AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE ET

First of all, the Panel would like to commend the programme development team for their proactive engagement with the Panel during the validation event. The Panel is very pleased with the level of optimism and positive atmosphere among all interviewed groups.

Having considered the documentation provided and discussed it with the programme development team, the Reaccreditation Panel recommends the following:

The overall compliance is assessed by the experts at the level of **Substantially Compliant**.

However, the following recommendations need to be considered in relation to programme reaccreditation:

1. The self-evaluation report is written very well, providing a lot of significant information, but to enable proper evaluation there should be more documents mentioned in the self-report attached. Besides, lack of the documents, all attached documents need to be translated into English. Without these documents it is hard to properly evaluate and give recommendations.





- 2. Regarding the evaluation of staff performance, it is suggested that the following criteria are integrated into individual staff records:
 - Systematic collection of data career progression and feedback from alumni and include their opinion in the learning process;
 - Regular staff appraisal in terms of identifying staff development requirements;
 - Staff membership in the educational and professional bodies;
 - Staff involvement in learning and teaching research initiatives;
 - Participation in learning and teaching events and conferences, the College should develop effective policies for teachers' improvement in the research.
- 3. It is necessary to further develop and integrate e-learning as a form of teaching strategy and provide online courses that are feasible to the specific needs of students.
- 4. The College has developed quality policy and procedures that include regular collection and analyses of relevant data with the purpose of ensuring and improving the quality of all institutional activities, especially student participation. Nevertheless, there is room for improvement, especially in actively involving the student body and external stakeholders in the decision making processes.
- 5. To attract more regular foreign guest lecturers and students, College should offer some courses in English. Furthermore, the College should try to attract incoming students not only from the region but also students from a variety of European countries.
- 6. To achieve greater publicity about College and its activities, it is recommended to set up a separate active College's web page where student and teacher achievements and all college activities would be presented. This would enable the public to be better acquainted with College's capabilities and working methods.
- 7. It is necessary to regularly update the College website, with current relevant information, as an example of relevant information are the list of teachers, the list of publications, etc.
- 8. It is strongly recommended that important documents such as the Statute, the regulations for students' transfer from other institutions, etc. are publicly available.
