1.3. A brief overview of the institution and program under evaluation

The University of Applied Sciences in Ferizaj (UASF) was established in 2015. As pointed out in strategic plan The University of Applied Sciences in Ferizaj is the only public institution in Kosovo specializing in applied sciences. The MSc programme in Engineering and Informatics is offered at the Faculty of Engineering and Informatics.

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The UASF mission includes providing quality education, to prepare qualified professionals, dedicated researchers and educated and responsible citizens to develop a professional career and lead a productive life. In this accreditation process UASF University has applied MSc in Engineering and Informatics (re-accreditation under a new name).

2. PROGRAM EVALUATION

2.1. Mission, objectives and administration

The mission statement of the University of Applied Sciences Ferizaj (in the following addressed as UASF) is clear and ensures evaluation of progress towards the institutions goals and objectives. The UASF the mission is periodically reviewed in the light of changing circumstances. According to the Self Evaluation Report (SER) and the observations of the remote interviews it can be stated that the mission is consistently used as a guide in resource allocation and major program, project or policy decisions. The mission of the programme as stated in SER “is to develop specialized professionals in the field of Engineering, with a focus on product development and design using the latest applications easily adaptable and technological processes, to the demands of the labour market” is quite broad and as such suitable for applied science university profile.

A strategic plan is elaborated, there was in process of development of new strategic plan 2022-26. In the new strategic plan it is differentiated clearly between yearly achievements, thus enabling predictive view in short, medium and long terms. In the document the KPIs at “Key performance indicators” are outlined by yearly target values. According to the structure of the university the operational, tactical and strategic objectives are updated regularly. There is Industrial Board involved in strategic planning. The strategic plan is also linked to the internal information management system by the university structure. The different tasks are discussed on the operational level by the faculty committees and a regular feedback on current activities, as well as progress in strategic initiatives is provided. The study program is in renaming process, where “Engineering and Production Management” is replacing the ongoing “Engineering and Informatics”. The step is reflecting the essence of study program and also corresponds to the



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needs of local industry. Based on the SER and the discussions while the remote interviews it can be stated that the decision making bodies ensure that the mission and strategic objectives are reflected in planning and activities.

The web page of university includes informatin and documentation both in Albanian and English and the documents for students are well findable.

Following representatives of the study program were interview partners while the remote meeting: Bujar Pira and Sejdi Hoxha. While the interview the main values formulated in the SER were discussed and there is no doubt that these values are integrated in the strategic development of the study program. The cooperation with industry and stakeholders is important when setting strategic goals and influence of industry was also evident whem meeting with alumni and industry representatives.

According to the process structure it is provided that the decision making bodies regularly review their own effectiveness with internal and external partners. So a clear plan for improvement is given. The main governing body establishes sub-committees (including members of the governing body, academic and administrative staff, students and external stakeholders) to give detailed consideration to major responsibilities such as finance and budget, staffing policies, strategic planning, quality assurance, facilities, etc.

Following students were interviewed while the remote meeting: Arlinda Ibishi, Diellza Misini, Tetovare Kolshi, Eugen Lipovica, Donika Guri, Arjeta Ramadani, Drilon Sylejmani and Ardhmëri Mehmeti. Student representatives are involved in the main decisional, executive and consultative bodies across the institution and it is provided that administrative staff make sure that action needed in their area of responsibility is taken in an effective and timely manner, anticipate issues and opportunities, and exercise initiative in response.

The Administrative staff encourages cooperation in achievement of institutional goals and objectives within their areas of responsibility, provide leadership, and encourage and reward initiative of team members it is supported by the staff development plan. The structure of the Steering committee and the organigram of the USAF guarantees that administrative staff work

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cooperatively with colleagues in other sections of the institution to ensure effective overall functioning of the organisation.

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2.2. Quality management

The review about quality management was held with the following leading structure of the quality management: Armend Hysa, Bujar Pira, Leonora Rudhani, Besa Rexhepi and Fatime Musliu.

Self-evaluation process is well prepared and the institution is supporting and facilitating training in the field of internal quality management for all of its staff, if they are internal employees or lecturers. Improvements in performance and outstanding achievements are recognized by evaluation and honoured. Indicators that are capable of objective measurement are identified for monitoring and evaluation of the performance of different units within the institution and of the institution as a whole. The format for specifying indicators and benchmarks is defined consistently across the institution while the application of the system is still in development.

The questionnaires are elaborated and spread also digitally, the feedback analysis is obtainable also for students. The feedback is gathered systematically. There are forms for alumni to gather their feedback.

Students participate in the design and implementation of quality assurance processes, mechanisms and instruments and continuous improvement methods are applied successfully. Case studies with local companies cooperation developed by five other Kosovo partner universities have been gathered and published. Student feedback is gathered by digitalised means. Benchmarks for comparing quality of performance are established for the institution as a whole, as well as for academic and administrative units. The external benchmarking is still not fully digitalised and portal for Alumni and Industry in development.

2.3. Academic staff

Following Teaching staff were interviewed: Mimoza Zhubi, Arbresha Meha, Bashkim Mustafa, Gazmend Deda, Rrahim Sejdiu, Flamur Salihu, Anyla Shala and Bardhyl Bejtullahu.



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The teaching staff corresponds to the qualification requirements. From 11 professors and lecturers responsible for the study program teaching 8 are full time employees. Based on the analysis UASF has set Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for all lectures and programs. The data these provide is reviewed at least annually by senior administrators responsible for academic affairs, the institution's quality committee and the institution's senior academic body. The reporting is done internally with the responsibility of the quality management department. The implementation of the study programs is monitored and substantiated through faculty committees and the steering committee in which efficient and innovating pedagogic technologies are developed.

Based on the concept of internationalization the study programs are also implemented at institutional level through cooperation between departments and facilitating students' mobility. Transfers and accumulation of ETCS credits is done with different international partner universities and international internships of students are supported. The structure of the study programme is flexible to a certain extend and allows students to choose lectures and contents corresponding to their interests and skills. The content of the study programmes is permanently updated by introducing new knowledge, resulting from scientific research, teachers knowledge and the industrial board, which is regularly corresponding according to the needs of the market.

The effectiveness of planned teaching strategies in achieving different types of learning outcomes is regularly assessed and adjustments are made in response to evidence depending on the actual situation. These assessments are done in the faculty as well as the overall institution. Assessments are linked to each academic staff member portfolio. Appropriate mechanisms are used to prepare students for study in a higher education environment. Students achievements are tested and evaluated by appropriate, valid and reliable mechanisms which are used in programs and throughout the institution. The standard of work required for different grades is consistent over time, comparable in courses offered within a program and the institution as a whole, and in comparison with other higher education institutions.

The Reports are provided to heads of faculty and program administrators on the delivery of each course and these include details if any planned content could not be dealt with and any difficulties found in using planned strategies.

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Staff members are at Covid caused shift in remote education trained regarding e-learning software use as Moodle and Teams.

2.4 Educational process content

As was recommended at previous evaluation report, the study programme is renamed to mirror the essential part of Production Engineering, and Management is also underlined as twin transition needs also changing in managerial mindset. Performance indicators are given consistently for the lectures and lecture Evaluations are carried out on a regular basis. The data collected by quality management is reviewed and discussed at least annually by the different institutional bodies of the university. These bodies also analyse and monitor the implementation of new teaching methods in the study programs to guarantee and improve efficient and innovating pedagogic technologies. The analysis and optimization of the educations contents are mainly done in the study program committees. The programme contains 12 mandatory and five elective courses. 3D modelling and visualization course is supported by modern VR technology and 3D scanner. CAM and CIM courses are supported by relevant software (AUTOCAD, INVENTOR, CREO, FUSION) and computer classes. The students feedback is available from the university web. There are no free choice study module allowing students to declare and choose courses from other study programmes, or other universities. Study program modules have targeted by learning outcomes. Remarks and recommendations of previous accreditation have been analysed and performed. Sustainability is handled in courses “Entrepreneurship and Innovation Management“ and „Management and Quality Standards“. Digitalisation is handled in course „Product and process design“.

2.4. Students

There are currently 87 students in the Engineering and Informatics study program. Students are active in Student Parliament. Now the students of the Bachelor program ‘Industrial Management’ have also a consecutive Master Program. Based on the discussion with the above mentioned students, quality management, academic and administrative staff as well as the leading authorities, following estimation can be derived. In principle the advisors are familiar with details

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of course requirements and this information is available to provide assistance prior to and during the admission process. Clear rules are established and maintained related to the privacy of information and controlling access to individual student records. Students are motivated and they feel the education from Ferizaj helps them to advance their career prospective at job market, and preferably to advance to graduate studies.

Procedures and reports are in place for monitoring student progress throughout their programs. The timelines for reporting and recording results as well as updating records are clearly defined and adhered to. Students are supported in development so-called Students Corner. Erasmus+ projects EUFORIA and CTPCIE have been used for establishing Innovation Lab InLAB available for Student projects and including VR, 3D scanning and CNC equipment.

Thus, also the collaboration of different study programs is supported more effectively.*

2.6 Research

Research is considered as a strategic goal of the University. The research of academic staff is internationally visible. The research in the study program is developing, there are no narrow research groups but academic staff members are covering broader area of Engineering. The laboratories have been improved with modern hi-tech from CNC machine tools up to 3D printers, 3D scanners and VR headsets. The main strategy for research development is joint research projects to provide dissertations with partner universities. UASF is monitoring and supporting staff's contribution to attracting financial resources through research and applied projects and products. The support for junior teaching staff in the development of their research programs is given by individual treatment, mainly mentoring by senior colleagues. Also mechanisms like



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inclusion in project teams and assistance in developing research proposals is done. The funding of entrepreneurial activities is actually not in the focus and should be developed in the future. The University has not yet established intellectual property policies. For the organization of research and company collaboration as specific institutional body is given and the capacity to identify and publicize institutional expertise and commercial development opportunities is in development. The cooperation with local industry and with other research agencies is strongly encouraged. The reporting in research performance and records based on the research activities of individuals, departments and colleges is actually not organized centrally. Assistance is given for teaching staff to develop collaborative research arrangements.

2.7 Infrastructure and resources

At draft strategic plan there is foreseen Improving the infrastructure for scientific work and innovation 3.3 million EUR by 2026. There have been made major investments into laboratories and student premises, also using effectively Erasmus+ support. The adequacy of library and other materials is monitored continually and evaluated once per year. The Library has access to several electronic resources besides over 1400 publications. Electronic evaluation processes include analysis of data on usage of resources and the teaching content evaluation evaluates the availability of adequate literature.



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Requirements of materials to support teaching and learning are being regularly collected from teaching staff responsible for courses and programs within the faculty committees. UASF has been installing elevator for access for students with special needs on all floors of the building.

The campus in Ferizaj there are adequate facilities available for confidential consultations between teaching staff and students. Also food service facilities are made available and are adequate for the needs of staff and students.

Facilities like two amphitheatres are ready made amounting 150 and 350 students, smaller classrooms and labs. There is still no workshop/protoshop place for students to assembly rapid prototype solutions and work by handtools independently.
