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1.3. A brief overview of the institution and programme under evaluation

The Faculty of Philosophy is the first academic unit of higher education in Kosovo. It was founded in 1960. The mission of Faculty is a proper education of the youth of Kosovo. It educates students to be worthy and useful citizens for the country. The Faculty of Philosophy has been the leader of many vital processes for Kosovo, despite the challenges it faced during its operation.

At the Faculty of Philosophy, there are seven departments:

- Department of History
- Department of Philosophy
- Department of Sociology
- Department of Psychology
- Department of Political Science
- Department of Social Work
- Department of Anthropology.

The mission of the Faculty of Philosophy is, through building and strengthening academic staff capacities, enriching the academic tradition with advanced European and international experiences and practices, through expanding cooperation, increasing professionalism, intensifying scientific research, as well as digitalization of administration and all services for students, to become an academic institution at the level of prestigious international universities, with an emphasis on those of the European Union, as well as to be a serious competitor in the academic market, not only in the region but also beyond.

The goals of Faculty of Philosophy are:

- education and upbringing of students in the field of philosophy, sociology, psychology, history, political science, ethnology, archivist and social work;





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- theoretical-practical training of students in the above areas to perform the tasks and obligations for which they are prepared;
- affirmation and implementation of the best achievements in European and world culture and science in the Kosovar society, culture, science and economy;
- scientific research of social phenomena and processes in Kosovo society and beyond;
- cultivating critical and creative thinking in the field of scientific theory and social practice;
- preparation of human resources, for the application of theoretical and humanistic knowledge, in practical life and their training for competition in relevant fields;
- promoting values and civic democracy to the new generation;
- cooperation in teaching, research and publications with sister institutions at national, regionaland international level;
- creation of professionally capable and morally responsible staff for the exercise of important social, political and educational-scientific roles and functions in society;
- integration in the European Higher Education Area and achieving student and teacher mobility;
- the interconnection and interdisciplinary nature of the fields of study, within the Faculty of Philosophy and in cooperation with other faculties of the University of Pristina;
- the establishment of competent staff capable of solving theoretical and practical problems related to the Kosovar society, solutions that would contribute to the economic, social, democratic, cultural and educational prosperity of the Republic of Kosovo.

Faculty of Philosophy permanently monitors the developments, both in higher education and in the education market in Kosovo. This monitoring is done through a wide range of uses:

- formal and informal meetings with relevant senior decision-making and policy actors;
- taking part in conferences, seminars and roundtables on higher education in Kosovo, in the regionand beyond;
- formal and informal internal academic discussions of the staff of the Faculty of Philosophy;
- invitation for public lectures at the Faculty of Knowledge on Education and other related issues;
- monitoring of prestigious scientific journals for relevant findings to higher education andmonitoring of the daily press for articles and analysis dedicated to higher education;
- monitoring in continuity the developments of other levels of education, in order to adapt and advance curricula, academic materials, teaching methodologies and evaluation.

The Faculty of Philosophy has 11 programmes with valid accreditation, 1 MA programme, as well as 3 programmes at the BA level in the process of accreditation, or re-accreditation.

The Faculty of Philosophy is located on the university campus, close to the National Library of Kosovo, the University Library, the Rectorate of the University of Pristina.





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2. PROGRAMME EVALUATION: Philosophy BA

2.1. Mission, objectives and administration

The mission of the study programme Philosophy BA is in full harmony with the mission of the Faculty of Philosophy and the University of Pristina, stated in its highest legal act – the Statute. Objectives are very well written.

In talking to the heads of the study programme and representatives of employers of graduates and external stakeholders, the expert team noticed that graduates are properly prepared to work in schools as well as in a variety of fields such as media world, politics, civil society. They are also well prepared for continuing MA level studies.

The administrative and academic staff is enthusiastic and ready to implement any recommendations. The management is proactive with the private sector and will send students to do their internships (media houses, schools, etc.). The media house has expressed their willingness to help the management in organizing round tables and discussions and be part of them. (Standard 1.1)

The learning outcomes are at a decent level as far as the expert team opinion is considered. The programme meets well the criteria of the National Qualifications Framework and the Qualifications Framework in the European Higher Education Area. The media house and the school were included, the most respected experts in the field of media will help the faculty with any questions and problems. The academic references and network seem to be elaborated. (Standard 1.2)

The study programme provides a well-defined overarching didactic concept. It also trains to create professional and intellectual capacities, capable of taking civic responsibility on social processes (Standard 1.3).

Typical basic processes are described in the SAR: quality processes, academic processes, application processes for students or teaching applicants are described. During the site visit, the management mentioned several times the importance and value of transparency. (Standard 1.4)





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Code of Ethics is established for academic and administrative staff and students. Continuous evaluation of students and academic staff is an important feature in the implementation of the study programme. During the site visit, the academic staff confirmed that there is no appropriate program for checking graduate theses against plagiarism. (Standard 1.5)

Several review processes and regulation mechanisms are described, which are also responsible for evaluating policies in different time frames. (Standard 1.6).

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2.2. Quality management

The SAR describes in detail quality management organization and processes. During the conversation with the QA members and staff, the expert team was informed that the below listed practises are implemented:

- Quality management is integrated into the life cycle of the programme
- A process for ongoing strategy improvement has been developed
- The department has regular monthly meetings before the regular meetings of the Council of the Faculty of Philosophy.
- QA regulations were fragmented
- Quality management staff members received training and will receive further training.
- The Department makes plans for the improvement of its programmes in accordance with the Statute of UP and its accompanying legislation, the Strategy for Development of the Faculty of Philosophy.
- Quality Assessment Questionnaire are going to be mandatory

QA revised comprehensively learning outcomes together with the Faculty. The problem-based teaching and learning approach is strengthened. The Department of Philosophy ensures that it continuously respects all the criteria set by the KAA regarding the quality component, consequently in every accreditation and re-accreditation has respected the recommendations required to achieve the standards by international accreditation experts.

The Faculty of Philosophy has implemented all recommendations that were given to them during the conversation with the expert team.

A specific COVID19 impact evaluation was not conducted. The expert team was informed that the extremely low percentage of students participating in the survey does not show real quality assessment results. Therefore, from this academic year, questionnaires are made mandatory to have more data to collect and analyse.

ET recommendations:

- 1. ET recommends that the data collected through the mandatory questionnaires are implemented and taken very seriously.
- 2. Given that mandatory evaluation questionnaires have only been introduced since this academic year, it is also recommended that a detailed and in-depth analysis of such a procedure be made in several cycles.
- 3. ET recommends training the staff especially the QA staff members





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2.3. Academic staff

The academic staff employed in the Department of Philosophy, within which this programme is implemented, carries out their FT activity in full compliance with the statutory provisions of the. The regular staff that has at least the title of Prof. is engaged for lectures. Ass. Dr or the degree of Dr according to the authorisations of the Faculty Council in certain cases, while for exercise the regular assistant. All academic staff that is engaged in this programme is on a full-time basis and acts in accordance with legal requirements, except for retired Professor Prof. Dr Kadri Metaj.

External staff is recruited for one academic year to hold exercises in some subjects.

The programme consists of 180 credits. The legal requirement is that for the number of 60 credits, at least one full-time staff member must be employed with a PhD degree. Therefore, a minimum of three full-time staff members holding a PhD must be employed which are





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employed. All full-time academic staff engaged in this programme has completed at least doctoral studies abroad: Astrit Salihu (doctorate in Zagreb, Croatia), Hasnije Ilazi (master and doctorate in Zagreb, Croatia), Kristë Shtufi (all levels of study in Austria); Blerim Latifi (master and doctorate of Tirana, Albania), Valon Leci (doctorate of Tirana, Albania). All academic staff of this program have knowledge of at least English languages

The cooperation within the University of Pristina offers possibilities for staff development. Elements and processes for an academic career are sufficiently described in the SAR. However, the SAR stated, as confirmed in a conversation with the expert team, that more academic staff is needed to carry out and develop this study program to high international educational standards. Therefore, academic staff remains deprived of certain opportunities for further professional development (Standard 3.6).

In the SAR the Faculty of Philosophy describes the typical academic activities sufficiently. These activities could be better portraited in the CV of the staff-faculty members. The lack of knowledge of specific languages such as German, French, where it is known that many great philosophers have written in these languages is a weakness of staff. The ET appreciates and considers a great effort of the staff that is translating foreign literature in their domestic language.

The number of published papers of academic staff could be improved. The reasons for the current situation can be found on several pages. First, pandemic conditions and increased pressure on teachers to teach online should be considered. But on the other hand, the lecturers confirmed in conversation with the expert team that there are not enough funds for the professional development of academic staff (Standard 3.7).

The ET has understanding for the current difficult situation of the institution and the additional pandemic crisis, but we recommend more publishing papers from the staff.

ET recommendations:

- 1. ET recommends that the staff should be stimulated to publish more.
- 2. Academic staff need to participate more in research by reducing teaching loads.
- 3. The development of academic staff should be enabled through financial support for greater participation in international conferences and scientific events.





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- 4. ET recommends rewarding scientific papers of high international visibility.
- 5. ET recommends improvement and standardization of the CVs.

2.4. Educational process content

Interdisciplinarity is considered in the BA program in Philosophy, especially derived from the fields of social sciences. Since philosophy and logic are taught in Kosovo in the schools as general gymnasiums and technical schools, but also ethics, civic education, and human rights. The ET encourages further cooperation with business partners such as the media house and school. The study programme is in line with the National Qualifications Framework and the Qualifications Framework of the European Higher Education Area. The programme is organised in three study years and six semesters. Through the designed programme, students manage to get 180 credits, for each semester they get 30 credits.

The programme's focus is clear. The central aspect of the programme is to enable students to teach philosophy, logic and related subjects in schools as well to work in different areas of social life. The study programme has clear qualification objectives for the field philosophy. (Standard 4.1)

The study methods are described in the syllabuses for each course. In general, the programme focuses on problem-solving skills, case studies, project work, problem-based learning, and simulated learning. (Standard 4.2)

The programme's focus provides a logical flow and leads to the development of general and specific learning outcomes in the curriculum. The programme offers elective courses for individual student focus. (Standard 4.3)

Syllabuses of the curriculum are well documented. The structure of the syllabi is standardised and sufficiently described by the faculty staff members. (Standard 4.4)

English skills are not regulated by the Faculty of Philosophy. (Standard 4.5)

Teaching strategies consist of different teaching methods described and customised for the courses and documented in the syllabuses. (Standard 4.7)





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The faculty is planning to use the learnings from the master programme also for the bachelor programme and implement them. Students are required to use also empirical research which is adequate for a bachelor thesis (Standard 4.8)

An overall assessment monitoring is established, which generates for every assessment a report. (Standard 4.9)

The BA program in philosophy does not provide any practical phase. But according to the nature of the study of philosophy, the BA program in philosophy contains seminar papers, homework, exercises, presentations, colloquia, and in some subject's class discussions are organised between groups of students related with practical topics, addressed in lectures (Standard 4.11)

The BA programme in philosophy does not envisage any practical phase. However, for issues of programme implementation and goal achievement, the Department of Philosophy works closely with the Kosovo Philosophers Association, and jointly organises various events, such as World Philosophy Day (Standard 4.12)

ET recommendations:

- 1. ET encourages the Faculty of Philosophy to test the English language of the students during the first and second semester and help them with additional literature in their domestic language if the students' knowledge of the English language is not sufficient.
- 2. ET recommends that funding be provided within the Faculty or University for the updated literature on specific subjects as well as for the translation of key literature into Albanian.
- 3. ET recommends that for the study of philosophy, as one of the basic and oldest studies at the University of Pristina, a doctoral procedure be initiated in order to complete the educational cycle according to the Bologna system.

2.5. Students

The evaluation process has confirmed the presence of information, outside the documents supplied in advance of the visit, that demonstrate institution-wide arrangements for student admissions, rights of representation, student feedback via 'satisfaction surveys', what students can expect during the studies, what is expected of them and what support can be provided if something goes wrong.

At the beginning of each academic year, within the general competition of the University of Pristina for the admission of new students, the competition for this programme will be announced. The competition will contain complete information about the competition, evaluation, and admission procedure in the Bachelor of Philosophy study programme. After the official announcement of the results of the entrance test, students have the right to appeal which are reviewed by the entrance examination commission within the Department of Philosophy.





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The Faculty of Philosophy established different regulations to deal with academic misconduct, including plagiarism and other forms of cheating: Code of Ethics for Academic Staff, Code of Ethics for Students, Code of Ethics for Non-Academic Staff. The Faculty of Philosophy does not have a plagiarism detection software, but they control the paper handed by students very strictly.

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6. Research

The Faculty of Philosophy has the Faculty Development Strategy 2018-2023 and the Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy. Research objectives and the dynamics of the realisation of the activities in the achievement of the objectives are defined with these strategic documents. The expert team encourages the Faculty of Philosophy to develop better ties with other institutions in the field of Philosophy regarding the research. (Standard 6.1)

The University of Pristina has regulated the issue of promotion of teaching staff, through a mandatory requirement for scientific research and their publication in journals with international credibility. This is defined by the Statute of UP, articles 164,165,166,167, 168 and 175,176, 177, and Recommendation of the Senate of UP no.1 / 344 dt. 22/06/2016. The platforms for publishing works are determined by the academic staff of UP, preferring the Scopus platform as the most appreciated. (Standard 6.2, 6.3)

The overview of the scientific publications of the academic staff of the Department of Philosophy for the last 5 years shows that the research results could be increased. Some of the research papers are older than 3, 5 or even more years. The expert team highly recommends publishing research papers frequently and proposes not only to request it from the University of Pristina but also to apply for funds from other sources. Publishing research papers is something that spreads and enhances the knowledge of professors and is also useful for the education of students.

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6.1. Infrastructure and resources

It should be mentioned that the evaluation of infrastructure and resources was made based on the information received from the institution via video and those declared by the participants in the meetings during the online accreditation. Also, the ET looked online for extra information regarding the infrastructure and resources.

Management of the Faculty of Philosophy will be in the building of the University of Pristina as the Faculty of Philosophy is part of the University. As noted by the staff and the management of the Faculty of Philosophy the buildings are renovated and painted. The students have told the expert team during the meeting that they have a library at the Faculty of Philosophy and one which is located within a two-minute walk from the faculty. It should be noted that the building of the faculty is suitably adapted for students with physical disabilities.

There is a videoconferencing equipment for streaming video lectures. Adequate computer equipment is available and accessible for teaching, staff and students throughout the institution, and technical support is available for staff and students using information and communications technology

During the meetings with the management, students, and the staff, the ET found out that the institution provides an adequate and well-maintained physical environment for its students and staff. 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ET recommendations:

- 1. The ET recommends a bigger library with more literature in the domestic language if possible and applicate the effort of professors who translate literature from the English language.
- 2. The ET recommends increasing support for the acquisition of the uptodate literature in foreign languages as well as subscriptions to international journals.

7. OVERALL EVALUATION AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE ET

The ET would like to thank the Dean, the Faculty management, the heads of the study programme, the academic staff, the employers and external stakeholders, the students and the graduates, of the Faculty of Philosophy for the well-prepared online meetings during the on-site visit as well as for their open discussion on all issues raised in the evaluation.

The ET finds that the objectives of the study programme Philosophy BA are well defined and are in full harmony with the mission of the Faculty of Philosophy and the University of Pristina. Graduates are properly prepared to work in schools as well as in a variety of fields such as media world, politics, civil society. They are also appropriately educated for continuing MA level studies. The administrative and academic staff is enthusiastic and ready to implement any recommendations. The management is proactive with the private sector and sends students to do the internships in media houses, schools, etc. The learning outcomes are at a decent level as far as the expert team opinion is considered. The programme meets well the criteria of the National Qualifications Framework and the Qualifications Framework in the European Higher Education Area. The academic references and network are well elaborated. The study programme provides a well-defined overarching didactic concept. It also trains to create professional and intellectual capacities, capable of taking civic responsibility on social processes.

In addition to these and other positive achievements, there are some minor shortcomings in the implementation of the study programme, that the expert team points out. The main two





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shortcomings stand out: lack of the teaching staff in general, and insufficient financial support for the research. The ET recommends to the Faculty, University and Government of Kosovo to establish regularly support of the scientific research. It will be crucial for the future development of the study programme to use and concentrate the teaching resources in order to acquire the necessary financial means to tie the academic staff in a sustainable manner. Faculty members who are receiving research funds have to be financially and institutionally awarded for their scientific achievements. They have to be able to take sabbaticals and to devote themselves to their research.

The ET recommends to the Faculty of Philosophy as an important task to further improve the level of the foreign language knowledge by the students participating in the study programme Philosophy. In this respect could be highly recommended to the Faculty of Philosophy to cooperate intensively with the Faculty of Philology to improve the foreign languages competence of students as well as of the teaching staff. It is recommended that every student should be obliged to attend at least one or two courses which are taught in foreign languages during a BA-programme. If every BA-thesis has to include a foreign language summary, such measures would help to improve the language skills.

The ET recommends to the University of Pristina and particularly to the Faculty of Philosophy to provide a budget for the teaching staff to translate major works from their subjects into the Albanian. A certain amount of the annual university budget could be offered to the academic staff as a kind of stimulation for translating significant philosophical books.

The ET recommends that teaching staff should be rewarded for their publications with greater international visibility.

The ET recommends increasing support allocations for organising public events to stimulate public debates on philosophical issues and to promote the study programme of BA Philosophy.





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Finding and final recommendation

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The study programme Philosophy BA as such and the given infrastructure as seen in the on-site-visit and in the examination of the documents is fully compliant with the standards included in the KAA Accreditation manual.

The expert team recommends to the KAA to accredit the study programme Philosophy BA for a duration of 5 years and 100 students per year.
