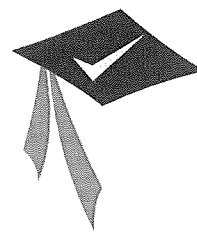

MONITORING REPORT

Tempulli Academy

Prishtina, 2024

1. Introduction

Brief description of the development of the monitoring procedure for the verification of the schedule of lectures and exercises, including data in chronological order (if applicable):

Based on Law No. 08/L-110 on the Kosovo Accreditation Agency (KAA), article 42 Monitoring, and the KAA Methodology for Monitoring and Post-Accreditation Procedures, Article 1.7 Monitoring Lecture and Exercise Schedules, paragraph 1.7.2, 'The monitoring of lecture schedules is done in order to ensure the compliance of the accredited curriculum according to the Self-Assessment Report, according to the Accreditation Manual (compulsory and elective courses, fund of lecture and exercise classes, practical work and the subject holder) with the schedule of lectures and exercises published by the higher education institution'. Based on Law No. 08/L-110 on the Kosovo Accreditation Agency, specifically Article 42 Monitoring with all points, in the Manual on Monitoring Methodology and Post-Accreditation Procedures, points 1.2. General monitoring, sub-points 1.3. Monitoring of study program providers and 1.4. Monitoring of official websites and advertising materials of HEIs, point 1.5. Monitoring according to the standards of the accreditation manual, with sub-points 1.6. Monitoring of academic staff, 1.7. Monitoring of lecture and exercise schedules, 1.8. Monitoring of infrastructure and resources as well as relevant decisions of the KSHC for accreditation/re-accreditation.

On 05.12.2024, the Kosovo Accreditation Agency (KAA) conducted a regular monitoring visit to "Tempulli Academy" to monitor programs that have accreditation under the conditions listed below. This visit was part of the monitoring process according to the monthly planning of KAA, to ensure continued compliance with accreditation requirements.

2. Preparation for the monitoring visit

In accordance with the standards set out in the Monitoring Manual, KAA officials organized a monitoring visit to the Faculty of Education at the University of Prishtina. The main goal was to verify the holders, the conformity of academic staff and the schedules of lectures according to the accreditation criteria. Prior to the visit, KAA officials reviewed RVV of accredited programs and relevant decisions to understand and collect information related to the study programs and simultaneously conducting analysis related to the findings.

3. Description of the Visit and the monitoring process

At the initial meeting, the director of Tempulli Academy Muhamet Krasniqi and Sara Fusha, quality coordinator at this institution, officials of KAA announced the purpose of the visit. The Coordinator of the Quality and Mr. Krasniqi informed the AKA team about the progress of the teaching process.

According to Mr. Krasniqi, although two programs are accredited, students enrolled only in *the Traffic and Transport Engineering program, BA Professional 180 ECTS (R) with three specializations*: with a total of only 30 students who pursue regular studies.

Classes are always held afternoon according to the student's request because most of them work in the morning.

The teaching hours of lectures and exercises were presented in physical copies, as the website of the institution was becoming new and due to malfunction of the website they had not yet been able to publish the academy's data. While students for schedules and schedule changes are notified through community group Viber as well as email, the institution also has an electronic system for student management.

Also, the officials visited the classrooms that were equipped and had a suitable environment for the development of learning.

Quality Coordinator, Sara Fusha also assured the team that there are no changes in the program holders, while the institution is familiar with procedures in case of any such change.

4. Final conclusions:

1. The monitoring team has found from the teaching schedules that the program holders are engaged and teach in the programs for which they are responsible.
2. The number of students registered by the quota is not exceeded.
3. The BA-Professional 180 ECTS, Insurance, Management and Innovation Program with three specializations (A): Damage Management and Evaluation, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, and Intelligent Systems in Transport and Logistics for the academic year 2024/2025 has no enrolled students.
